



TexQuest offers premium digital resources for K-12 students in Texas public and open-enrollment charter schools, and is provided with shared funding from the state legislature, via the Texas State Library and Archives Commission (TSLAC).

What resources are included in TexQuest?

- Magazine, newspaper, encyclopedia, academic journal, and reference book articles with citations – easily searched and shared
- Full text eBooks and magazines with simultaneous access
- Copyright safe images, videos, and audio files
- Rich primary sources materials to support TEKS and new SAT
- Features like text-to-speech, translate, TEK and lexile search

What can my child access in TexQuest?

TexQuest resources include full-text magazines and E-books, articles from reference books, newspapers, and journals, videos, images, audio files, historical materials, and web links.

How is searching on TexQuest different from an Internet search?

The resources in TexQuest are not available on the open web and are selected specifically for students. Many of them align with the state curriculum standards. Students can search by content or reading level and use features to have resources read aloud, translated, linked, and/or downloaded.
